Minutes of the review meeting held under the Chairmanship of worthy Chief Secretary with all the Deputy Commissioners through Video Conferencing on 28.01.2016 from 12:00PM onwards.

All the Deputy Commissioners or their representatives attended the review meeting from their respective offices through Video Conferencing.

At the outset Secretary CAPD Department gave a detailed resume of the various fundamentals performed by all the Deputy Commissioners with regard to digitization of legacy data and fidelity check to Worthy Chief Secretary. After getting the feedback from Secretary CAPD Department Worthy Chief Secretary took final stock of preparedness for implementation of National Food Security Act from concerned Deputy Commissioners.

Worthy Chief Secretary informed to all the Deputy Commissioners that at present the Government's first priority is uploading the priority households corresponding to 74.13 lac which have been identified and to be hosted on the National Portal. Thereafter, detailed district-wise review was taken and it was noted that about 59 lac souls have been uploaded under priority and digitization is still not complete. Almost all the Deputy Commissioners sought some more time to complete the process of fidelity check of the digitized data. Some Deputy Commissioners sought time of 3-4 days, some others sought 6-7 days and 04 other Deputy Commissioners sought 10-12 days time to complete the process of fidelity check and hosting the data on National Portal. In this way districts can be categorized in three categories on the



basis of time sought for fidelity check and hosting the data on National Portal:-

Those districts which sought 3-4 days to finally complete the process of fidelity check and issuance of ration card and hoisting of data are:

Bandipora, Budgam, Srinagar, Anantnag, Kulgam and Shopian.

ii. The districts which sought 6-7 days time to complete the process of fidelity check and hosting the data on National Portal on issue of ration cards are:

Baramulla, Kupwara, Pulwama, Ganderbal, Udhampur, Samba, Kathua, Poonch, Reasi, Doda.

iii. The districts which sought 10-12 days time to complete the process of fidelity check and hosting the data on National Portal are: Jammu, Kishtwar, Ramban and Rajouri. While as, Leh and Kargil are lagging behind.

The final extension and timeline sought by the various DDCs during review under the chairmanship of worthy Chief Secretary on 28-01-2016 is summarized as under:-

Worthy Chief Secretary listened to the issues raised by the Deputy Commissioners and sought its resolution from NIC on which SIO NIC explained that 25 customizations of software has been done at the behest of



DDC. In almost all the districts entire data is digitized and segregation is done and only fidelity check is underway. Most of the issues raised were software related issues to which State Informatics Officer, NIC, J&K and Nodal Officer, e-PDS gave their clarification and assured of resolving the same within 2-3 days. CS also asked SIO, NIC to share all innovations / customizations in one district with others so that the changes are absorbed by all DIOs and DDCs simultaneously.

Worthy Chief Secretary desired that next review may be taken by him on 6th February, 2016. Chief Secretary further desired that all the requisite certificates must be furnished by Deputy Commissioners after having been satisfied about the fidelity of the data digitized. Chief Secretary directed all DDCs that they must work in Mission Mode and strive to achieve the target in their district.

It was also mentioned that DDCs shall undertake extensive IEC campaign to keep public aware of fidelity process, Aadhaar seeding and beneficial tenants of National Food Security Act, 2013.

Meeting ended with thanks and advice to all concerned to adhere to timelines.
